1. The purpose of the proposal or decision required (Please provide as much information as possible)

Agreement is sought to proceed with the procurement of a block contract for the provision of a Trusted Assessor service. The current contract for the provision of a Trusted Assessor service in Sandwell expires at the end of March 2021. The service will be tendered on a two-year contract with an option to extend for a further one year, subject to satisfactory performance.

The contract will be funded through the Better Care Fund (BCF).

2. Evidence used/considered

The requirement to introduce trusted assessors is a condition of Better Care Funding. The Better Care Fund Policy for 2017-19 has a strong focus on better management of patient flow and Delayed Transfers of Care (DToC), mandating Health and Well-Being (HWB) areas to implement the High Impact Change Model (HICM). The model identifies eight key system changes that have the greatest potential to deliver tangible impacts on patient flow and DToC.

Of the 8 eight key system changes, Change 6 is identified as a Trusted Assessor model (using Trusted Assessors to carry out a holistic assessment of need avoids duplication and speeds up response times so that people can be discharged in a safe and timely way). Put simply, the model puts forward the idea of one profession or service trusting the assessment of another profession or service and acting upon it. Successful outcomes of the Trusted Assessor model should include the expediting of existing processes to facilitate the reduction in DToC's and the promotion of safe and timely discharges. While there is no one recognised model for Trusted Assessors, it should be subject to the agreement of local partners, with the model varying from others depending on local circumstance.

The recently published Department of Health and Social Care Hospital Discharge Policy and Operating Model (21st August 2020) states "using trusted assessment to carry out a holistic strengths-based assessment avoids duplication and speeds up response times so that people can be discharged in a safe and timely way. During COVID, it has worked well and should be sustained among professional groups and between care settings".

Trusted Assessor schemes are a national initiative designed to reduce delays



when people are ready for discharge from hospital. Providers adopt assessments carried out by suitably qualified 'Trusted Assessors' working under formal, written agreements. Assessments and care planning can be undertaken by Trusted Assessor schemes in a way that meets both people's needs and legal requirements on providers. By using trusted assessors, we can reduce the numbers and waiting times of people awaiting discharge from hospital and help them to move from hospital back home or to another setting speedily, effectively and safely.

The service supports the smooth transition for patients from hospital into a care home setting. The primary aims and objectives of the service:

- reduction in avoidable discharge delays through more timely assessment
- ensuring there is a single, agreed assessment process to reduce duplication
- reducing assessment burden for care practitioners and providers.
- improvement in hospital discharge arrangements from
- improving patient experience, clinical safety and patient flow (moving away from a focus solely on winter pressures to a year-round approach to supporting timely hospital discharge)
- facilitating discharge where issues have arisen which could compromise the quality or timeliness of discharge from hospital

The benefits for Sandwell Council of this service are:

- Reduction in DToC attributed to the Council
- A co-ordinated response with health partners in relation to timely and effective hospital discharges.
- Mitigating the potential imposition of fines by Acute Trusts for DToC.

The benefits for service users and carers:

Timely hospital discharge

The Trusted Assessor service has proved to be an invaluable service especially during the Covid -19 pandemic. The service alleviates the pressure on care home managers having to undertake assessments and they can focus on providing essential care. The feedback received of the service is positive.

3. Consultation



Commissioners have consulted with stakeholders across Sandwell Better Care Fund and internal intermediate care teams for their view on the provision of the service and there is consensus that the loss of the service will jeopardise the favourable DToC position and result in delays in transfer being coded against the Council.

4. Assess likely impact

Agreement to procure the contract aligns with the focus of both the Council and Sandwell and West Birmingham Clinical Commissioning Group to support the reduction of DToC and will support the continued flow of patients from hospital back to their communities.

The service will benefit vulnerable people as a result of a more timely and responsive service.

The service has worked well in facilitating more timely hospital discharges, and procuring a new contract when the existing one ends, on 31st March 2020 will enable that to continue.

Not undertaking a procurement exercise will create a gap in provision, leading to delays in discharges.
