Additional HMI questions

- Number of pupils who have become EHE since April 2020 who are also open to social services: 2 children who are on a CIN Plan. (In total there are now 5
- Numbers of SEND pupils, including those with EHCPs, who have become EHE since April 2020, and if there are any patterns in the types of SEND: EHCP 5, SEND 34, with no obvious pattern
- Number of families where all children in the family are now EHE, since April 2020: Unfortunately we do not currently hold the data in a format that enables us to answer this question, the team are however looking to see if we will be able in the future.
- Number of children whose parents have given COVID-related reasons for choosing EHE, since April 2020: 90
- Any patterns in terms of postcodes/areas where children have become EHE, since April 2020: No pattern have emerged, numbers have increased fairly evenly across the wards
- Is LA aware of any patterns of schools where numbers of EHE referrals are high (Ofsted would not use this to inform inspection activity unless we receive a concern from the LA or other body): no schools have seen significant increase to EHE referrals.
