1/18 Minutes

Resolved that the minutes of the meeting held on 20 November 2017, were confirmed as a correct record, with the addition that apologies were received from Councillor Allen.

Matter delegated to the Committee

2/18 Appeal against the decision of the Adaptations Panel

The Committee considered an appeal by Mr S, against the decision of the Disabled Facilities Grant Adaptations Panel.

The appeal was on the grounds that Mr S had been assessed as needing a step lift to allow him access to his home, a vertical lift to allow him access the first floor of his home and a level access shower facility.

An offer to rehouse Mr S to a suitably sized, level access property had been made. Mr S declined the offer on the basis that he preferred to stay in the home that he had lived in for many years.

General Purposes and Arbitration Committee 26 February 2018

Subsequently, Mr S had requested a reduced scheme of adaptations, which consisted of the bathroom adaptations only. This request was rejected by the Disabled Facilities Grant Adaptations Panel following advice from the Occupational Therapist that adapting the bathroom alone would not meet the needs of Mr S.

In reaching its decision, the Committee considered the report of the Executive Director – Adult Social Care, Health and Wellbeing and the appellant's written and verbal submissions.

The Committee further considered the cost implication of the adaptation, and that it would exceed the Disabled Facilities Grant limit of £25,000 and that it was neither reasonable nor practicable to make the adaptation.

Resolved

- (1) that the decision of the Disabled Facilities Grant Adaptations Panel, to not award Mr S a Disabled Facilities Grant under the Housing Grants, Construction and Regeneration Act 1996, to provide a step lift to allow him access to his home, a vertical lift to allow him access the first floor of his home and a level access shower facility, be upheld;
- (2) that the Housing Service Manager be requested to liaise closely with Mr S to ensure a more suitable property is found to meet his needs in a timely manner.

DECISION RECOMMENDATIONS

The Committee:

- 1. To endorse the existing provision of the 154 Polling Stations as outlined in appendix 1 for the Local Elections taking place on the 3 May 2018.
- 2. For a statutory review of UK parliamentary polling districts and polling places be undertaken by the Director Monitoring Officer in the next municipal year between 1 October 2018 and 31 January 2020 (inclusive).
- 3. A further report outlining the findings and recommendations of the review be presented to the committee as soon as possible thereafter.

1 PURPOSE OF THE REPORT

- 1.1 To confirm the current proposals for polling stations for the local elections 2018 as outlined in Appendix 1 to this report.
- 1.2 To inform the committee of the need to carry out a statutory review of existing polling stations; and seek authority to undertake that review.

2 IMPLICATIONS FOR SANDWELL'S VISION

2.1 An effective polling district and polling place scheme supports Sandwell Councils Vision 2030, Ambition 10.

Ambition 10.

Sandwell now has a national reputation for getting things done, where all local partners are focused on what really matters in people's lives and communities.

3 BACKGROUND AND MAIN CONSIDERATIONS

- 3.1 The committee is requested to endorse the use of the existing provision of polling stations as appended to this report for the Local Elections, 3 May 2018.
- 3.2 Section 18B of the Representation of the People Act 1983 (RPA 1983) sets out that the each local authority must designate the polling places for the polling districts in its area.
- 3.3 Paragraph 25 of Schedule 1 of the RPA 1983 states that the Returning Officer must provide a sufficient number of polling stations, shall allocate electors to those polling stations, and those polling stations shall be in the polling place for that district.
 - At least once every four years a review of all polling districts and polling places is required to be carried out in accordance to the legislative requirements as detailed below.
- 3.5 Section 18C(1) of the RPA 1983 sets out that local authorities must carry out and complete a review of polling districts and polling places in the period specified by section 18C(2)(a) of the RPA 1983. This means that all local authorities must review their

- UK Parliamentary polling districts and polling places at least once every four years.
- 3.6 The next statutory review must be started and completed between 1 October 2018 and 31 January 2020 (inclusive).
- 3.7 An outline of the process is set out at Appendix 2 to this report.
- 3.8 A detailed assessment of the suitability of both existing and proposed alternative polling stations will be undertaking, which will assess each stations against a defined criteria/yardstick.
- 3.9 The findings of the review will be analysed and presented to the committee for consideration, along with appropriate recommendations.

4 CONSULTATION (CUSTOMERS AND OTHER STAKEHOLDERS)

4.1 As part of the statutory polling district and polling place review consultations will take place between all of the relevant stakeholders in relation to the existing provision of polling stations as detailed in appendix 1 and in relation to any alternative proposals.

5 **ALTERNATIVE OPTIONS**

5.1 As part of the formal polling place review alternative options to the existing provision of polling stations will be considered, a final report will be presented to this committee for approval in the new municipal year.

6 STRATEGIC RESOURCE IMPLICATIONS

6.1 The use of polling stations is already included within the existing budgetary provision for the conduct of local elections and as such no financial implications are outlined in this report.

7 LEGAL AND GOVERNANCE CONSIDERATIONS

7.1 The legal implications are set out in the main body of this report.

8 EQUALITY IMPACT ASSESSMENT

8.1 As part of the formal review that will take place when assessing the location of polling places, accessibility issues will be investigated to ensure that proposed polling stations have access to voters with disabilities.

9 DATA PROTECTION IMPACT ASSESSMENT

- 9.1 The new General Data Protection Regulations (GDPR) will be in force when the polling districts and polling places review commences.
- 9.2 Officers will ensure that regulations are considered and included in the review to ensure compliance with regards to the use of personal data.

10 CRIME AND DISORDER AND RISK ASSESSMENT

10.1 As part of the formal review risk assessments will be carried out on all existing and proposed stations prior to any recommendations.

11 SUSTAINABILITY OF PROPOSALS

11.1 The review will consider the long-term availability of polling stations and places to ensure there is stability and certainty for voters so far as reasonably possible.

12 HEALTH AND WELLBEING IMPLICATIONS (INCLUDING SOCIAL VALUE)

13.1 Ensuring that the council elections arrangements are effectively managed helps ensure the electorate has confidence in and has the opportunity to engage in the democratic function.

13 IMPACT ON ANY COUNCIL MANAGED PROPERTY OR LAND

13.1 A number of council premises are used as polling stations which has an impact on the use of those premises for normal/usual business. Mitigating measures are taken where possible to minimise any disruption.

14 CONCLUSIONS AND SUMMARY OF REASONS FOR THE RECOMMENDATIONS

- 14.1 This report provides details of the polling stations to be used for the Local Elections taking place on 3 May 2018.
- 14.2 This report also provides details of the planned formal review of polling districts and polling places pursuant to Section 18C(1) of the RPA 1983.
- 14.3 The review will be carried out between 1 October 2018 and must be completed by 31 January 2020.
- 14.4 A subsequent report outlining the findings and recommendations as a result of the review will be returned for approval by this committee.

Formal review process (Schedule A1 steps)

When carrying out the review, local authorities must:

publish a notice of the holding of a review consult the (Acting) Returning Officer for every parliamentary constituency which is wholly or partly in its area publish all representations made by an (Acting) Returning Officer within 30 days of receipt by posting a copy of them at the local authority's office and in at least one conspicuous place in their area and, if the authority maintains a website, by placing a copy on the authority's website seek representations from such persons as it thinks have particular expertise in relation to access to premises or facilities for persons who have different forms of disability. Such persons must have an opportunity to make representations and to comment on the representations made by the (Acting) Returning Officer(s).

On completion of a review, give reasons for its decisions and publish:

- a. all correspondence sent to an (Acting) Returning Officer in connection with the review
- all correspondence sent to any person whom the authority thinks has particular expertise in relation to access to premises or facilities for persons who have different forms of disability
- c. all representations made by any person in connection with the review
- d. the minutes of any meeting held by the council to consider any revision to the designation of polling districts or polling places within its area as a result of the review
- e. details of the designation of polling districts and polling places within the local authority area as a result of the review

1 PURPOSE OF THE REPORT

- 1.1 The Committee is invited to consider the nomination of persons to the offices of the Mayor and the Deputy Mayor of Sandwell for the Municipal Year 2018/2019.
- 1.2 The Council, at its meeting on 8 January 2013, approved the process for the selection of Mayor based on the following criteria:-
 - nominees shall be serving members of Sandwell Council who have not previously served as Mayor;
 - nominees shall have given notable service to the Borough of Sandwell as a councillor and/or within the local community;
 - each nomination shall be submitted by a serving member of the Council supported by five other serving members of the Council, regardless of political party.

- 1.3 All members of the Council have been invited to submit nominations for the office of Mayor and one valid nomination has been received in respect of Councillor Edis.
- 1.4 The nomination for the office of Deputy Mayor will be reported at the meeting.

2 IMPLICATIONS FOR SANDWELL'S VISION

2.1 As the first citizen of Sandwell, the Mayor and his or her Deputy are ambassadors of the Council, thus promoting and thereby contributing to all of the Council's ambitions.

3 STRATEGIC RESOURCE IMPLICATIONS

3.1 The Council makes financial provision annually to enable the functions of the Mayoralty to be undertaken. Staff support is provided by the Mayor's Office.

4 LEGAL AND GOVERNANCE CONSIDERATIONS

- 4.1 The Council is legally required to appoint a ceremonial Mayor and Deputy Mayor for the 2018/19 municipal year.
- 4.2 The General Purposes and Arbitration Committee has the responsibility under its terms of reference to make recommendations to the Council on nominations for the Ceremonial Mayor of the Council.
- 4.3 The role and responsibilities of the Mayor are contained within Article 5 of the Council's Constitution.
