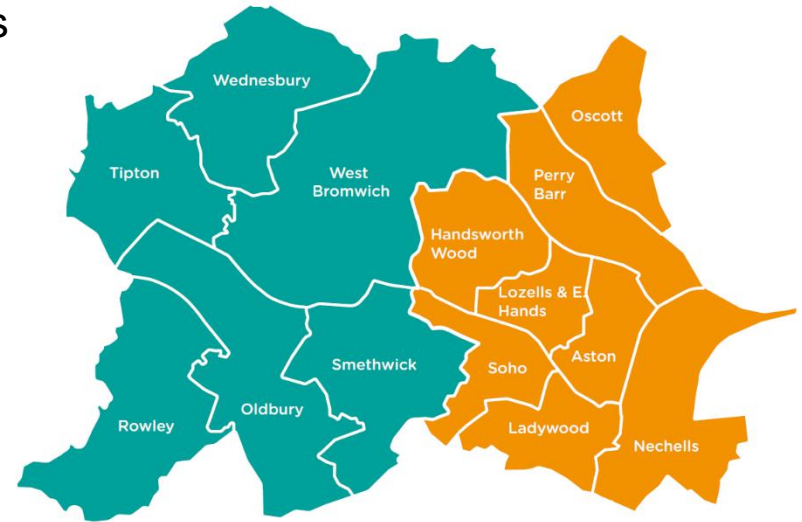
The future is bright

- NHSE Long Term Plan (published in January 2019) is creating opportunities for us to work together differently
- Sandwell - part of Black Country and West Birmingham (STP) Integrated Care System – a joined up approach to health and care across the Black Country and West Birmingham
- Care Alliances – social care, health and voluntary and community sector coming together
- Primary Care Networks – 10 in Sandwell and 5 in West Birmingham
- Midland Metropolitan Hospital opens in 2022



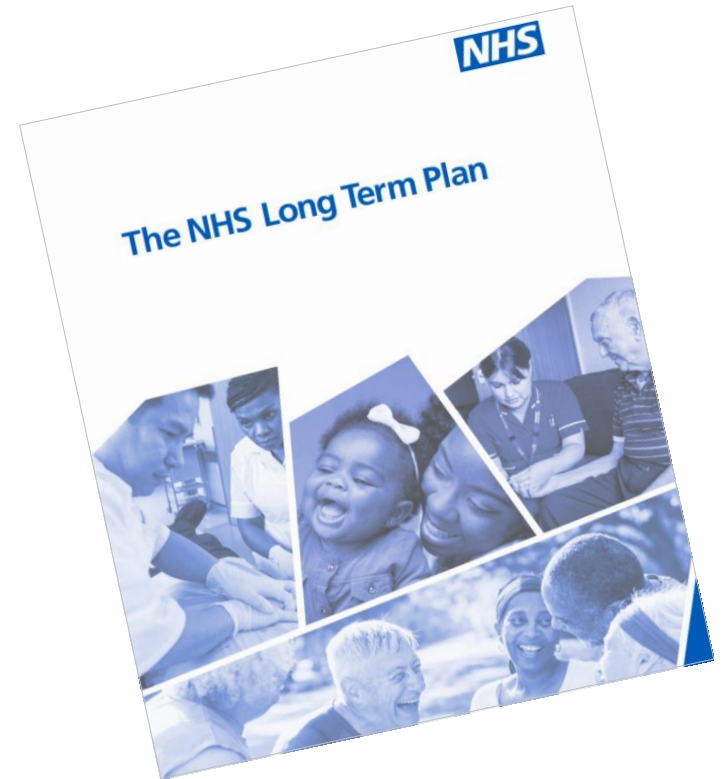
One system – two places

- Creating two place-based Care Alliances across the CCG/trust footprint
- Focusing on population health and agreed health outcomes
- Working with multiple partners within our alliances
- Wrapping care around our PCNs – expanding the role of primary care in our communities
- Harnessing and developing the capabilities of the voluntary, community, charitable and faith-based sector



A high-performing system

- Sandwell and western Birmingham have a track record of innovation and joint working
- The NHS Long Term Plan brings new investment to extend the scope of primary and community services
- Local commitment to a primary care model of long-term preventative care
- Local people will get more control over their health – huge opportunity to personalise care
- Strong leadership – new SWBCCG clinical chair; single AO for Black Country CCGs.

- **Capitated budget** which pays for outcomes and patient experience
- **Longer term contracts** based on delivering better health outcomes
- A firm **commitment to increase the funding** to the Voluntary, Community and Social Enterprise Sector
