### **LPS Pathway**



Authorising arrangements

- Arrangements can be authorised for enabling the care or treatment of a person (aged 16+) that give rise to a deprivation of liberty
  - Can be in any setting & multiple setting
  - Can include means & manner of transport

Who is responsible body?

- If arrangements mainly carried out in an NHS hospital, the "hospital manager"
- If arrangements mainly carried out in an independent hospital, the Local Authority
- If arrangements are mainly via CHC, the CCG
  - otherwise, the Local Authority (the authority meeting the person's needs or in whose area the person is ordinary resident)

### Authorisation Process

#### Capacity Assessment

- person lacks capacity to consent to the arrangements
- Medical Assessment
  - person has a mental disorder
- Necessary & Proportionate Assessment
  - necessary to prevent harm to person & proportionate to likelihood & seriousness of such harm
  - must have regard to person's wishes and feelings

### Consultation with...

- The Person
- Any named person
- Carer or anyone interested in the person's welfare
- Any deputy or attorney
- IMCA or appropriate person























### **Pre-authorisation Review**



Preauthorisation Review

> Before the Responsible Body authorises the Deprivation of Liberty, a pre-authorisation review is undertaken to check all the evidence and the paperwork to see if the conditions are met for authorisation

Approved
Mental
Capacity
Professional
(AMCP)

In complex cases or when a person is objecting to a deprivation of liberty, the preauthorisation review is done by an Approved Mental Capacity Professional (an AMCP), who must meet the person.

The Local Authority must approve all the AMCP's for all the Responsible Bodies within the area.























## Care Home Arrangements (Applies to those aged 18+)



Responsible Body decides which pathway applies



(1) The care home manager leads the process, or



(2) The Responsible Body arranges the authorisation
