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| | Why is the local authority (LA) considering this if the Shireland Collegiate converted to an academy? RK confirmed that the formula is for all Sandwell schools, an example given was historic commitments a cost which is topsliced from all Concerned that LA to find costs for Q3 also. Some BSF schools are struggling with facilities management costs; there is no information to give scope to this category. RK stated that she presented to primary and secondary schools – schools will be asked if they have exceptional premises costs and to inform RK. If the exceptional premises factor costs increases this will mean less funding will be distributed to all schools. Concerns were discussed that swimming for schools is 1% more than the schools budget. This has potential impact on staffing adjustments in schools NASUWT stated the living wage will be implemented in April 2016; this has not been factored in. RK stated the employer contributions of NI and superannuation - the expectation is that schools will continue to fund this, | Responsible |
