1 Recommendations

- 1.1 In view of the prescribed timescale within which the Tividale ward byelection must be held, the Committee confirms its support for the proposed changes to the Polling Places and Polling Stations in the Tividale ward as set out in the Appendix to this report.
- 1.2 Given the limited time available, the Committee notes that the Returning Officer will use his delegated powers to implement the proposed changes to the Polling Places and Polling Stations in the Tividale ward recommended in this report.

2 Reasons for Recommendations

2.1 Following the recent, sad and untimely death of Councillor Hevican, a councillor in the Tividale ward, the Council will now be holding a by-election on 15 July 2021 to fill her vacant seat.



















- 2.2. The proposed course of action relocates the sites of three existing Polling stations away from schools and means that no headteacher based in the Tividale ward will be forced to close their school because of the need to hold this by-election.
- 2.3. Against a background of a disrupted year for pupils, the recommendations contained in this report are consistent with a request made to Returning Officers, by the Department for Education and the Cabinet Office in February 2021, to minimise any further disruption to pupils' education by avoiding using schools as Polling stations, where it is practically possible to do so.
- 3 How does this deliver objectives of the Corporate Plan?



Strong resilient communities

The recommendations detailed in this report will enable voters living in the Tividale ward opportunities to engage in the democratic process by being able to vote, in person, at their appropriate Polling Station, whilst enabling schools in the ward to remain open on the day of polling. Electors will continue to have the right to apply to vote by post or by proxy too.

4 Context and Key Issues

- 4.1 Section 18B of the Representation of the People Act (RPA) 1983 states the authority must designate the polling places for the polling districts in its area. Each polling district must have a polling place and it is the duty of the Council to designate polling places and keep them under review. The Council is required, so far as is reasonable and practicable to designate polling places which are accessible to disabled electors.
- 4.2 Paragraph 25 of Schedule 1 to the RPA 1983 states that the Returning Officer must provide a sufficient number of polling stations, shall allocate electors to those polling stations, and those polling stations shall be in the polling place for that district.

















- 4.3 The appendix to this report sets out the details of a desire to relocate three Polling Places to new locations in the Ward together with the rationale for seeking to make such changes.
- 4.4 The RPA also requires local authorities to, periodically, conduct and complete a review of Polling Districts and Polling Places. The next compulsory review of all polling places must be completed between October 2023 and January 2025.
- 4.5 Prior to the local elections being held in May 2022, further reviews of school-based Polling stations in Sandwell will be conducted to explore the feasibility of relocating such sites to non-educational venues and thereby enable schools to remain open.

5 Alternative Options

- 5.1 In making the recommendations outlined in this report, officers have considered a number of alternative sites in each of the affected Polling districts and concluded that, for reasons based on availability, location, size and ease of access, the locations detailed in the appendix are the most suitable in each case.
- 5.2. These recommendations have been shared with relevant Ward members and they have said:

I am happy with the change from Grace Mary and Oakham schools to Oakham Evangelical Church on City Road. I am a little concerned regarding the change from Tividale Hall Primary School to Tividale Football Club on Packwood Road. Whilst the football club is only a short distance from the school it is rather out of the way and we will need to make sure residents are fully aware of where to access the polling station. This will mean signage from the main road Regent Road not just outside the actual station.

Governance: Risk:	As a result of the recommendations contained in this report, by enabling schools in the Tividale ward to remain open, the risk to pupils' education will be reduced. As was the situation in the May 2021 elections, the new, alternative venues will be managed and made as safe and Covid-secure as possible. To minimise risk of electors going to the incorrect (i.e. "old") Polling Station, a number of mitigations will be put in place. These include: • Poll Cards for the by-election will specify details of the elector's new Polling Station and highlight that there has been a change to the location. • Each household affected will receive a letter explaining the change and the details of their "new" polling station. • The council's website will be updated to reflect the change • Temporary signs placed at each former location, advising electors of their "new" Polling Station for these elections and along the route to the new station.
Equality:	Details of the proposed recommendations have been shared, through Sandwell Council of Voluntary Organisations, with disability groups in the Borough. No objections to the recommendations have been received to date and any comments received subsequent to the production of this report will be shared verbally with members at the Committee.
Health and Wellbeing:	The recommendations contained within this report enable voters, living in the Tividale Ward to be able to vote, at a Polling Station, in person in the forthcoming elections, should they wish to do to so.

Proposed changes to Polling stations in the Tividale ward

- 1.1 As members may be aware, three of the five Polling Places in the Tividale ward are primary schools (i.e. Tividale Hall, Oakham and Grace Mary) and, because of the recent Local, West Midlands Mayoral and Police and Crime Commissioner elections they were forced to close to pupils on 6th May to accommodate voting.
- 1.2. To try to avoid similar closures occurring when the by-election is held, it is proposed that alternative venues are used and thereby allow all three schools to remain open to pupils on the day of the poll.
- 1.3. Following a review of available premises in the Ward, the following Stations/Places are proposed for the forthcoming elections.
 - Polling district: TIA Currently Oakham Primary School It is proposed that the Station is re-located to Oakham Evangelical Church, City Road, Tividale (see also TID below).
 - Polling district TIB Currently Tividale Hall Primary School
 It is proposed that this double station is re-located to Tividale
 Football Club, Packwood Road, Tividale.
 - Polling district TIC Currently Oakham Library
 No change proposed
 - Polling district TID Currently Grace Mary Primary School
 It is proposed that the Station is re-located to Oakham
 Evangelical Church, City Road, Tividale (see also TIA above)

Polling district TIE – Currently Residents' lounge, Darley House

No change proposed

1.4. As members will see, it is being proposed that the Polling Stations at Oakham Primary School and Grace Mary Primary School are re-located to Oakham Evangelical Church, thus it being a double station. The church is situated mid-way between the two existing Polling stations (0.3 miles from Oakham Primary and 0.2 miles from Grace Mary Primary) and, following a site visit, is considered to have all the necessary attributes necessary for a Polling station (e.g. off-street parking, situated on level ground, wheelchair accessible, and would allow for a one-way system in/out of the building to be put in place, if necessary).

Tividale Football Club is situated in Packwood Road, 0.4 miles from the existing polling double station of Tividale Hall Primary. Again, following a site visit, it is considered the proposed venue would prove to be a suitable site for a double polling station.

Officials from both the church and the Football Club have indicated a willingness for their premises to become Polling Stations.

Subject to an evaluation of the effectiveness of the two new, proposed Polling stations after the forthcoming by-election, it will be recommended that both venues remain as polling stations for future elections too.

1 Recommendations

That Council be recommended to:-

- 1.1 grant approval for the signing and execution of the Pension Fund Admission Agreement which will allow catering staff working at Hargate Lane Primary School to continue to participate in the Local Government Pension Scheme as a result of a TUPE transfer to Aspens Services Ltd.
- 1.2 delegate authority to the Chief Executive to sign the Admission Agreement on behalf of the Council and for the Director of Law and Governance and Monitoring Officer to make arrangements for the document to be executed under deed of seal.

















2 Reasons for Recommendations

2.1 To ensure that those staff formerly employed by the Council can continue to participate in the Local Government Pension Scheme as part of their employment with Aspens Services Ltd.

3 How does this deliver objectives of the Corporate Plan?



Best start in life for children and young people

Having good health is essential for children of all ages, ensuring that they feel happy and living fulfilled lives.

The provision of healthy and nutritional school meals to our primary school pupils contributes to this key objective.

The contribution primary school catering staff provide is a fundamental support service to young children.

4 Context and Key Issues

- 4.1 A Pension Fund Admission Agreement must be signed and executed by all parties to the agreement to enable catering staff employed by Hargate Lane Primary School who have been transferred from the Council to Aspens Services Ltd, to be able to continue with participation in the West Midlands Pension Fund Scheme.
- 4.2 Full consultation has taken place between Council officers, and officers from both West Midlands Pension Fund and Aspens Services Ltd (The other parties to this agreement).

















5 Alternative Options

5.1 If approval of the Admission Agreement is not granted, then those former Council employees would no longer be eligible to participate in the West Midlands Pension Scheme. Those employees would suffer significant financial loss arising from the curtailment of their accrued future pension benefits.

Legal and	Execution of the Admission Agreement under deed of

Risk:	The Admission Agreement takes the form of a "Pass through arrangement" which has been agreed by all parties to the document.
	This means that Aspens Services Ltd will incur the same employers pension contribution rates in respect of both past service deficits, and future service rates as the Council.
	Therefore, there is no requirement for the Council to underwrite any past service pension deficits by way of a pension guarantee or similar liability.
Equality:	To ensure that those former employees who transferred to Aspens Services Ltd under TUPE arrangements continue to have the same pension rights after the transfer.
