Following the recent, sad and untimely death of Councillor Hevican, a councillor in the Tividale ward, the Council will now be holding a by-election to fill her vacant seat on Thursday 15 July 2021

The proposed course of action relocates the sites of three existing Polling stations away from schools and means that no headteacher based in the Tividale ward will be forced to close their school because of the need to hold this by-election.

Against a background of a disrupted year for pupils, the recommendations contained in the report, are consistent with a request made to Returning Officers, by the Department for Education and the Cabinet Office in February 2021, to minimise any further disruption to pupils' education by avoiding using schools as Polling stations, where it is practically possible to do so.

The report deals with this information and recommends suitable alternative places in which electors in relevant districts in the Borough can exercise their right to vote, in person.
