1 Recommendations

1.1 That the Committee considers recommending that Council confer the status of Freedom of the Borough to Sandwell & West Birmingham NHS Trust.

2 Reasons for Recommendations

- 2.1 In accordance with section 249 of the Local Government Act 1972, the Council has the authority to admit suitably qualified persons to the status of Freedom of the Borough.
- 2.2 The Committee is invited to indicate whether it would wish to confirm the title on any person or persons. If the Committee wishes to nominate a suitable person, it is recommended that an extraordinary meeting of Council is held on 24 October 2023, prior to the ordinary meeting of Council. The Council will consider this Committee's recommendations and, if appropriate, pass the necessary statutory resolutions required by Section 249 of the Local Government Act 1972.



















3 How does this deliver objectives of the Corporate Plan?



Nominations for Freedom of the Borough are an endorsement of the eminent service and commitment to the residents of Sandwell.

4 Context and Key Issues

- 4.1 The Council may, by resolution passed by not less than two-thirds of the members voting thereon at a meeting of the Council specially convened for the purpose, consider the admittance of persons to be the status of Freedom of the Borough. The persons should be of distinction or persons who have, in the opinion of the Council, rendered eminent service to the Borough.
- 4.2 The National Health Service celebrated its 75th birthday on the 5th July. As such, Sandwell & West Birmingham NHS Trust was nominated for Freedom of the Borough (Sandwell) for the selfless public services it has given and commitment shown to Sandwell residents over the years
- 4.3 The NHS overall and in turn the Trust, is a kind, caring, compassionate and great institution that every resident of Sandwell has reason to be proud of.
- 4.4 Bestowing this honour on the Sandwell & West Birmingham NHS Trust acknowledges the hard work, devotion and impact the NHS and the Trust, particularly its staff, has had on Sandwell residents.
- 4.5 This honour, which is the highest honour that the Council can bestow, is a clear demonstration of the deep affection Sandwell has for the Trust and NHS and to do so in the 75th anniversary year of the NHS is a fitting way to show the resident's heart-felt appreciation.
